NOTIFICATION

Karachi, the 6TH June, 1983.

No. S.GENL : 19-3/78.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 17 of the Sind Government Educational and Training Institutions Ordinance, 1960, the Government of Sind are pleased to make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be called the Sind Law Colleges (Board of **Short Title.** Governors) Rules, 1983.

2. In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or **Definitions.** context

- (a) “Board” means a Board of Governors constituted under the Ordinance for a Law College or Colleges in Sind;
- (b) “Chairman” means the Chairman of a Board;
- (c) “College” means any Law College under the Administrative control of a Board;
- (d) “meeting” means a meeting of a Board;
- (e) “member” means a member of a Board
- (f) “Ordinance” means the Sind government Educational and Training Institutions Ordinance, 1960;
- (g) “Presiding Officer” means the Chairman and includes the member elected under sub-rule (4) of rule 4;
- (h) “Principal” means the Principal of a College;
- (i) “Secretary” means the Secretary of a Board;
- (j) “section” means a section of the Ordinance.

3. The headquarters of the Board for Law College at Karachi, shall be at Karachi and the Board for other Law Colleges shall be at such place as Government may direct. **Headquarters.**

4. (1) A Board shall meet at least once in six months; provided that the Chairman shall, on receipt of a requisition signed by not less than one-third of the members, convene a special meeting within seven days of such requisition. **Meetings.**

(2) The Secretary shall, with the permission of the Chairman convene a meeting.

(3) The meeting shall ordinarily be held at the headquarters of the Board.

(4) The meeting of a Board shall be presided over by the Chairman and in his absence, by the member elected by the members present in the meeting.

(5) One-third of total number of members shall form a quorum for a meeting; provided that if the meeting is adjourned for want of quorum the members present at the meeting next following the adjournment shall form the quorum.

(6) Any matter required to be decided by a Board, shall be Decided in a meeting by majority of votes of the members present and voting.

(7) Each member shall have one vote; provided that in case of a tie the presiding officer shall have a casting vote.

5. (1) The amount credited in the fund of a Board shall be deposited with the State Bank or its Agencies or with the approval of Government with a scheduled bank. **Fund.**

(2) A Board may invest its funds in any security of Federal Government or Provincial Government or in any other security approved by Government.

6. (1) A Board shall prepare or cause to be prepared a statement of estimated receipts and expenditure for every financial year (hereinafter referred to as the budget) and submit the same to Government for approval two months before the commencement of such financial year. **Budget.**

(2) If a Board fails to prepare and submit budget as aforesaid Government may have the necessary statement prepared and certify it to be the sanctioned budget.

(3) At any time before the expiry of a financial year, a revised budget for the year if necessary, may be prepared and submitted to Government for approval.

(4) The estimated receipts and expenditure in respect of each college shall be shown separately in the budget.

(5) Government may sanction the budget including revised budget with or without any modifications as it deems fit.

(6) If the budget duly sanctioned by Government is not received before the commencement of the financial year, it shall be deemed to have been sanctioned by Government.

(7) A Board or College shall not, except with prior approval of Government (obtained through the Board in case of a College), incur expenditure in excess of the Sanctioned budget.

7. (1) The accounts of a Board and each College under its administrative control shall be maintained in the same form and manner in which the accounts of the offices and departments of Government are maintained. **Maintenance of Account.**

(2) The accounts maintained under sub-rule (1) shall be audited by a Chartered Accountant appointed by Government, and the Accountant shall furnish the audit report in duplicate to the Board for the purposes of sub-section (2) of section 15:

Provided that Government may authorize the Accountant-General, Sind to conduct the test or other audit of accounts on such terms and conditions as Government may determine.

8. A civil servant transferred to serve under the Board or any College shall, in respect of service matters, continue to be governed by the terms and conditions applicable to him immediately before his transfer or subject to the provisions of section 9 by such terms and conditions as Government may, from time to time, specify. **Conditions of service.**

9. A Board shall submit or direct the colleges to submit the following returns and statements to Government:— **Returns.**

- (a) the annual statement of the activities and expenditure of the Board;
- (b) the annual statement of the activities of such college prepared by the Principal and approved by the Executive Committee constituted by the Board;

- (c) the annual statement of the members of teaching staff indicating the total period for which each such member has served in the college and the remuneration paid to him for giving tuition during the year;
- (d) the annual statement containing the number of students admitted in each college, showing separately the number of students admitted in each class, and the number of students of each class, and the number of students of each class appearing in the annual and supplementary examinations, if any, and the percentage of successful students of each class in such examination;
- (e) the syllabus prescribed for the year for each class.
