SIND ORDINANCE NO. XLII OF 1984.

AN

ORDINANCE

to amend the Police Act, 1861, in its application to the Province of Sindh.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Police Act, 1861, in its application to the Province of Sindh, in the manner hereinafter appearing; Preamble.

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Proclamation of the fifth day of July, 1977, and the Provisional Constitution Order, 1981, the Governor of Sindh is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance:—

Short title
and com-
mencement.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Police (Sind Second Amend-
ment) Ordinance, 1984.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

Amendment
of section 30
of Act V of
1861.

2. In the Police Act, 1861, in its application to the Province of Sind,
in section 30, in the proviso to sub-section (3), the fullstop at the end shall be
replaced by a colon and thereafter the following new proviso shall be
added:—

“Provided further that he shall refuse to grant a licence in a case
in which the Magistrate of the district or of the sub-division of a
district is satisfied and conveys such satisfaction to him in writing that
the grant of the licence is likely to cause a breach of the peace or to be
prejudicial to the public safety or public interest or the maintenance of
public order.”.
