

SIND ORDINANCE NO. VI of 1970

THE WEST PAKISTAN CIVIL SERVICES (APPELLATE TRIBUNALS) (SINDH AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1970

[3RD SEPTEMBER, 1970]

An Ordinance to amend the West Pakistan Civil Services (Appellate Tribunals) Ordinance, 1969.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the West Pakistan Civil Services (Appellate Tribunals) Ordinance, 1969, in the manner hereinafter appearing; **Preamble.**

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Martial Law Proclamation of 25th March, 1969, read with the Provisional Constitution Order, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Governor of Sind is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance :-

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the West Pakistan Civil Services (Appellate Tribunals) (Sindh Amendment) Ordinance, 1970. **Short title and commencement.**

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. In the West Pakistan Civil Services (Appellate Tribunals) Ordinance, 1969, in section 5, after sub-section (4), the following new sub-sections shall be added, namely:- **Amendment of section 5 of W.P Ordinance XXVIII of 1969.**

“(5) If the Chairman or any one of the members of a Tribunal is, for any reason, unable to attend any sitting of the Tribunal, the sitting may be held by the two members, or the Chairman and the other member, as the case may be, and any appeal or other matter may be heard at such sitting and decision given thereon by them.

“(6) If, upon any matter requiring the decision of a Tribunal, there is a difference of opinion between its Chairman and a member or members, or between its members, the opinion of the majority shall prevail and the decision of the Tribunal shall be expressed in terms of the view of the majority.”.
