Preamble

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[14th March, 1979]

An Ordinance to validate the dissolution of the Consumers' Council and provide for the utilization of its assets.

WHEREAS it is expedient to validate the dissolution of the Consumers' Council and provide for the utilization of its assets. **Preamble.**

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Proclamation of the fifth day of July, 1977, read with the Laws (Continuance in Force) Order, 1977, the Governor of Sind is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance:-

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Sind Consumers' Council (Dissolution) Ordinance, 1979. **Short title and commencement.**

(2) It shall come into force at once and shall take effect not with standing any law or rules, or bye-laws, constitution or Memorandum of Association or any judgment, order or decree of any Court.

2. In this Ordinance, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context--- **Definitions.**

(a) "Council" means the Consumers' Council set up by the Government letter No.1.5/104, dated 24th November, 1973;

(b) "Board" means the Price Stabilization Board referred to in Government Notification NO.S.O (Dev)-3-6/70, dated the 30th October, 1970;

(c) "Government" means the Government of Sind.

3. (1) The Council shall be deemed to have been validly dissolved, by Government Memo NO.E&A(SPSB)/18-9/74, dated the 25th August, 1977. **Dissolution of the Council.**

(2) All assets and liabilities vesting in and enforceable against the Council, shall, on its dissolution, be deemed to have been transferred to and vested in, or as the case may be, enforceable against, the Board.

(3) Government may at any time after coming into force of this Ordinance replace the Board by an authority as it may deem fit and, if any such authority is appointed, the assets and liabilities shall vest in and be enforceable against that authority.

4. Government may make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance, including the purposes for which and the manner in which the assets of the Council will be utilized. **Rules.**
