

**SIND ACT NO. I OF 1988.**

**THE SIND PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARIES (SALARIES, ALLOWANCES AND PRIVILEGES) (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1987.**

[7<sup>TH</sup> January, 1988]

**AN ACT** to amend the Sind Parliamentary Secretaries (Salaries, Allowances and Privileges) (Amendment) Act, 1974.

**WHEREAS** it is expedient to amend the Sind Parliamentary Secretaries (Salaries, Allowances and Privileges) (Amendment) Act, 1974, in the manner hereinafter appearing;

**Preamble.**

It is hereby enacted as follows :—

1. (1) This Act may be called the Sind Parliamentary Secretaries (Salaries, Allowances and Privileges) (Amendment) Act, 1987.

**Short title and commencement.**

(2) It shall come into force at once and shall be deemed to have taken effect on and from the 26<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1987.

2. In the Sind Parliamentary Secretaries (Salaries, Allowances and Privileges) Act, 1974, hereinafter referred to as the said Act, in section 4, for the words “one hundred twenty five rupees” the words “one hundred and fifty rupees” shall be substituted.

3. In the said Act after section 4, the following new sections shall be inserted :—

“4-A. Accommodation.

(1) A Parliamentary Secretary shall be provided with an official residence free of rent.

(2) Where the Parliamentary Secretary is not provided with an official residence or prefers to reside in a private residence, he shall be paid house rent at the rate of one thousand five hundred rupees per month.

4-B. other facilities.

A Parliamentary Secretary shall be entitled to the—

(i) Services of a whole time Steno-typist and a Naib Qasid;

- (ii) Charges of rental of the residential telephone and official calls made there from not exceeding one third of the amount admissible to him as member of the Assembly under clause (b) of section 6 of the Sind Assembly Members (Salaries, Allowances and Privileges) Act, 1974.

4-C. Leave.

(1) Leave of absence may be granted to a Parliamentary Secretary by the Chief Minister at a time or from time to time, for reasons of health or private affairs, for an aggregate period not exceeding three months during the whole term of his office.

(2) A Parliamentary Secretary shall be entitled to leave allowance equal to his salary.

4-D. Travelling Allowance.

(1) A Parliamentary Secretary shall be entitled to draw the travelling allowance for performing any journey in connection with his official duties as Parliamentary Secretary at the same scale as is admissible to a member of the Assembly.

(2) The Minister with whom the Parliamentary Secretary is attached, shall be the Controlling Authority for the purposes of Travelling Allowances."

4. The Sind Parliamentary Secretaries (Salaries, Allowances and Privileges) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1987 is hereby repealed.
