

SIND ORDINANCE NO.XVII OF 1974
THE SIND (AMENDMENT OF LAWS) ORDINANCE, 1974

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[22nd October, 1974]

An Ordinance to amend certain laws applicable to the Province of Sind, for conferring powers on Commissioners.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend certain laws applicable to the Province of Sind, for conferring powers on Commissioners in the manner hereinafter appearing;

Preamble.

AND WHEREAS the Provincial Assembly is not in session and the Governor of Sind is satisfied that circumstances exist which render it necessary to take immediate action;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of Article 128 of the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan. The Governor of Sindh is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance: -

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Sind (Amendment of Laws) Ordinance, 1974.

Short title and commencement.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. Save as expressly provided the Acts and Ordinances specified in the Schedule shall stand amended in the manner indicated in the fourth column thereof and, rules, regulations, bye-laws, notifications and orders made or issued thereunder shall be construed, so far as applicable and with necessary adaptations until altered, repealed or amended.

Amendments.

3. Any appeal, review or revision petition or any other case pending before the Revenue Commissioner immediately before the coming into force of this Ordinance shall stand transferred to and be disposed of by the Commissioner having jurisdiction.

Transfer of appeals, etc.

4. A Commissioner may—

(i) visit or inspect any project sponsored, under the Annual Development Programme or by any local authority;

(ii) call for any information, report or record relating to such project from the officer Incharge thereof within the Division.

Inspection of projects.

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Explanation.— The power under this section shall not entitle the Commissioner to give any direction or orders involving administrative or financial implications.

5. The Sind (Amendment of Laws) Ordinance, 1972, is hereby repealed. **Repeal of Sind Ordinance III of 1972.**

15. (1) The Board of Revenue may at any time call for the record of any case pending before, or disposed of by, any revenue Officer subordinate to it.

(2) A Commissioner may call for the record of any case pending before or disposed of by, any Revenue Officer, under his control.

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(3) The Board of Revenue may, in any case called for under sub-section (1), and a Commissioner may, in any case called for under sub-section (2), pass such order as it or he thinks fit:

Provided that no order shall be passed under this section reversing or modifying any proceedings or order of a subordinate Revenue Officer and effecting any question of right between private persons without giving those persons an opportunity of being heard.

16. (1) The period of limitation for an appeal under section 14 shall run from the date of the order appealed against, and shall be—

(i) sixty days, when the appeal lies to the Commissioner;

(ii) ninety days, when the appeal lies to the Board of Revenue.

(2) In computing the period of limitation for an appeal under this section the period requisite for obtaining copies of the order appealed against shall be excluded.

(3) The provisions of section 5 of the Limitation Act, 1908, shall apply to appeals under this Chapter.”.

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(4) The Commissioner shall, after considering the objections received under sub-section (3) and hearing such persons as he may consider necessary forward his recommendations along with the application and other connected papers to Government for orders."
